Section 1. 4 oz Linen Fabric Section 2. Serrated Edge Tape

SPECIAL NOTE.

In view of the present national emergency the following modifications have been permitted to this Specification by the Ministry of Aircraft Production to allow the use of Irish Flax.

Section 1. Linen Fabric. When Irish Flax is used the fabric shall conform to the requirements as given in British Standard 6 F. 1 except as indicated below:—

Clause 1. Quality of Yarn. Paragraph 1 (b). This paragraph to be replaced by the following :—

 $\lq\lq$ The counts of yarn before boiling shall be 70s warp and weft. $\lq\lq$

Clause 2. Weave. In paragraph (b) the numbers "74 and 76" to be inserted in place of "80 and 90."

Clause 5. Weight and Strength. In paragraph (a) the weight of 4 oz. to be replaced by $4\cdot 2$ oz. per square yard.

Section 2. Serrated Edge Tape. When Irish Flax is used the serrated edge tape shall be cut from fabric which complies with the modified requirements of Section 1 as given above. In all other respects serrated edge tape shall comply with the requirements of Section 2 in B.S. 6 F. 1.
